Through our community-based Centers and school-based partnerships, CYC brings exciting afterschool and summer enrichment to more than 1,400 youth annually.

Our youth workers combine intentional teaching of important 21st-century and social-emotional skills—like creativity, communication, collaboration, and critical thinking—with innovative enrichment clubs focused on STEM, the arts, health, and recreation. Bolstered by the support of caring mentors, strong social emotional skills, and a love of learning, CYC youth are equipped to become tomorrow's leaders, thinkers, and innovators.

Our Approach to School-Based Afterschool Programming

CYC's 21st AVE program launched in 2007 and has served hundreds of children via partnerships with nearly a dozen Chicago schools over the past decade. By partnering with schools, CYC reaches children where they are and provides critical academic supports, exciting enrichment opportunities, and social-emotional development. CYC's 21st AVE is purposefully designed to complement schools' efforts to help students meet local and state performance standards, improve their academic outcomes, and ultimately provide them with the skills they need to thrive in the 21st century.

FLEXIBILITY.

Choose the schedule and grade levels that work best for you.

Using research-based curriculum, our youth workers can run programming for every grade level from Kindergarten to 12th grade. Partner schools can choose to offer clubs for a subset of grades or for all grade levels the school serves. The choice is yours.

The schedule is yours too. We are prepared to provide a menu of afterschool clubs five days per week, but can tailor the schedule to only offer programs on specific days if you decide. Our typical program is from 3-6 p.m. and lasts for 30-40 weeks – a 10-week session in fall, winter, and spring with an option to add summer programs.

Bottom line: we want the schedule to work for you AND for your students.

Choose the clubs that make sense for your students.

Variety, voice, and choice – these are the components of an effective afterschool program. Student interests and school needs should shape what becomes a diverse menu of afterschool clubs to join. We survey students and work closely with you to design a 10-week session with different offerings on different days.

For some school partners, CYC's 21st AVE is the one-stop shop. Our full-time site coordinator can work directly with you to design afterschool programming for the entire academic year, including summer. That means working with content-specific partner organizations as well. We don't have to be the direct provider of every club, but we can help you coordinate and communicate your full-suite afterschool options.

We want to be a value-add for you and your school—a real partner with principals and teachers, rather than another task to manage.

Choose a funding model that maximizes every dollar.

CYC's model is not only affordable, but it provides leveraged value for every dollar allocated.
